## **Quaternity Option**

The Liberal Studies Quaternity option is a student-centered option that aims at exploring four different, but interconnected concepts of knowledge—thinking, feeling, intuition, and sensation—which are derived from the complex interaction of mythos (story, fable, imagination) and logos (truth, fact, reality). Students in the Quaternity option are expected to approach and to integrate all of their courses through this epistemological lens, and to demonstrate that they have done so through writing assignments in the Liberal Studies seminars and other course assignments. Note that Online Quaternity students now have the option to add a fully online Sustainability & Environmental Stewardship minor to their degree program.

In addition to the integrative seminars, university core, and the liberal studies requirements, students in Quaternity require a foreign language (6 cr) and an additional 4 courses (12+ cr) in *each* area of Quaternity: 1.) arts, 2.) humanities, 3.) natural science *or* mathematics, and 4.) social sciences. At least six (6) of the 12+ credits in each area of Quaternity must be upper division (300- or 400-level).
